Job Responsibilities

This position is accountable for assisting the squad in the preparation of plans for highway and bridge improvements by performing drafting, calculations, and routine tasks.

This position reports to the Senior Design Squad Leader.

This position functions within a design squad, which is primarily accountable for accomplishing projects assigned by the Project Engineer. Duties performed by this position often impart upon other design squads, particularly in the case of bridge structures and hydraulic designs and in those cases when design squads are assigned joint projects. The geographic area within this position encompasses a 9-county area that is primarily rural but does contain urbanized areas including Kankakee.

Typical problems faced by the incumbent include ensuring that drafts prepared comply to prescribed standards and specifications. The major challenge of this position is to draft plans and calculate quantities which are clear and concise and completed in a timely manner.

The incumbent is personally responsible for preparing quantity computations. His/Her assignments include drafting cross sections, profiles, roadways, driveways, sewers, utilities, and other features on highway plans. This position is responsible for ensuring that the layout of each plan sheet is consistent with overall design to ensure that the complete set of plans is clear and concise.

(Job Responsibilities continued)

In accomplishing the objectives of this position, the incumbent must operate within the limits of prescribed design standards and specifications. Problems relating to alternative approaches to highway design and/or deviation from original scope of layout are referred to the Senior Design Squad Leader for further consideration.

The incumbent's primary contact is with the Senior Design Squad Leader for the purpose of receiving assignments, which may include assisting with surveys, traffic counts, taking field measurements, and travel to active construction sites.

The effectiveness of this position can be measured by quantity, accuracy, and timeliness of design data, which is incorporated into highway facility improvement plans.

Principal Accountabilities

1. Drafts simple and basic layouts of highway improvements which are used in preparing complete sets of design plans.
2. Performs quantity calculations for accuracy and completeness.
3. Accomplishes assigned tasks in a timely manner to facilitate the letting of contracts on schedule.
4. Performs duties in compliance with departmental safety rules. Performs all duties in a manner conducive to the fair and equitable treatment of all employees.
5. Performs other duties as assigned.
