

What is HSIP?

- ▶ The Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) is a **core Federal-aid program** with the purpose to achieve a significant **reduction** in traffic **fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads**, including non-State-owned roads and roads on tribal land. The HSIP requires a data-driven, strategic approach to improving highway safety on all public roads with a focus on performance.

Local HSIP Projects for Fiscal Year 2021

- ▶ 39 Total Applications
 - ▶ 26 Approved
 - ▶ 13 Denied
 - ▶ Awarded \$23.2 M
- ▶ For FY22 anticipated \$16.2M of funding
 - ▶ Solicitation Early Spring/Summer 2020

HSIP Project Types

- ▶ Modernized Signals
 - ▶ Signal head per lanes
 - ▶ Left/right turn lanes
 - ▶ Reflective backplates
 - ▶ Pedestrian countdown signals
 - ▶ Flashing Yellow Arrows (FYA)
- ▶ Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB)
- ▶ Improve Lighting
- ▶ Pedestrian crosswalks & sidewalks
- ▶ Add shoulders and shoulder/centerline rumblestrips
- ▶ Roundabout
