## Illinois 116 resurfacing in Livingston County begins Aug. 22

**PONTIAC** – The Illinois Department of Transportation today announced that, weather permitting, resurfacing on Illinois 116 from Illinois 23 to 1.71 miles east of Illinois 116 in Livingston County will begin Monday, Aug. 22.

The project consists of milling and resurfacing, traffic signal upgrades, pavement patching, ADA ramp improvements and minor drainage work. Traffic will be reduced to one lane under flagger control during the workday through May 5, 2023.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. To avoid the work area, when feasible, use of alternate routes should be considered. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to changed conditions and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits, refrain from using mobile devices, and be alert for workers and equipment.

Over the next six years, IDOT is planning to improve more than 2,500 miles of highway and nearly 10 million square feet of bridge deck as part of the Rebuild Illinois capital program, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. Accomplishments through Year Three of Rebuild Illinois included approximately \$8.6 billion of improvements statewide on 4,422 miles of highway, 412 bridges and 621 additional safety improvements.
