Springfield Avenue signal work begins June 13

CHAMPAIGN – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced that traffic signal maintenance on Springfield Avenue (Illinois 10) at two intersections in Champaign is set June 13-14.

Traffic will be controlled by four-way stop signs at Springfield and Staley Road on June 13 and at Springfield and Duncan Road on June 14. Work will begin at 7 a.m. each day and will last about five to eight hours, depending on the weather.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. To avoid the work area, when feasible, use of alternate routes should be considered. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to changed conditions and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits, refrain from using mobile devices and be alert for workers and equipment.

Over the next six years, IDOT is planning to improve more than 3,500 miles of highway and 9 million square feet of bridge deck as part of the Rebuild Illinois capital program, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. Accomplishments through Year Two included approximately \$5.2 billion of improvements statewide on 3,020 miles of highway, 270 bridges and 428 additional safety improvements.
