## **Addison Street resurfacing begins Sept. 19**

**CHICAGO** – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced today that a patching and resurfacing of Addison Street, between Avondale and Sacramento avenues, in Chicago, will begin, weather permitting, Monday, Sept. 19.

To complete the work, intermittent daytime lane closures and temporary parking restrictions will be required. Access to residences and businesses within the work zone will be maintained throughout construction.

The \$1.3 million project, which also includes constructing new ADA-compliant sidewalk ramps, is expected to be completed in spring 2023.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.

Over the next six years, IDOT is planning to improve more than 2,500 miles of highway and nearly 10 million square feet of bridge deck as part of the Rebuild Illinois capital program, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. Accomplishments through Year Three of Rebuild Illinois included approximately \$8.6 billion of improvements statewide on 4,422 miles of highway, 412 bridges, and 621 additional safety improvements.
