"Just having HCCTP on my résumé gave me an advantage, as the hall and local companies know the quality of workers they will get from this program," she said.

Johnson recommends other women consider careers in construction. "We deserve the same income stability of men," she said. "It's hard work, sure, hard work that has built my character and made me a stronger person inside and out."

Jessica Johnson is a construction wireman at Tri-City Electric and on track to become an apprentice electrician in May 2021.

"My whole life I never thought I would have a retirement," she said.

Shepard was always interested in construction, but she didn't learn about HCCTP until her 40s. Someone gave her the phone number for the program. She called and never looked back. Shepard liked how HCCTP covered a little bit of everything, and she really enjoyed working on a roof during the program. The hands-on experiences and learning about various trades helped Shepard decide on carpentry, which she knows is the right fit for her. She regularly returns to HCCTP classes to share her story with students.

"I want everybody to find their niche," Shepard said. "We need women in construction."
