Wilson Avenue over the Edens bridge repairs begin April 1

CHICAGO – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced today that repairs to the bridge carrying Wilson Avenue over the Edens Expressway (Interstate 94), in Chicago, will begin, weather permitting, Monday, April 1.

To complete the work, Wilson Avenue will be reduced from two lanes to one in each direction over the bridge, with lane widths reduced to 9 feet. Motorists also should expect various lane shifts on both sides of Wilson Avenue approaching the bridge.

Throughout construction, the inbound Edens ramp to Wilson Avenue and the Wilson Avenue ramp to the outbound Edens will be closed. In addition, the Wilson Avenue ramp to the inbound Kennedy Expressway (Interstate 90/94) also will be closed. Drivers should follow the posted detours.

The \$1.1 million project, which consists of repairing the bridge deck and approaches, replacing expansion joints and resurfacing, is anticipated to be completed in September.

The public can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Alternative routes are encouraged. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.

Over the <u>next six years</u>, IDOT is planning to improve more than 3,000 miles of highway and nearly 10 million square feet of bridge deck as part of Rebuild Illinois, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. <u>Accomplishments</u> through Year Four of Rebuild Illinois included approximately \$12.1 billion of improvements statewide on 5,339 miles of highway, 533 bridges and 762 additional safety improvements.
