The courses listed on the following pages constitute the Technology Transfer Training Program and are scheduled to be presented on the dates and locations indicated. These classes are all tuition-free, unless otherwise noted. Travel, meals and lodging expenses are always the responsibility of the student.

ENROLLMENT

We invite your agency to enroll students in the classes you desire by completing our online [enrollment form](#).

It is important that you enroll early. Some classes fill up quickly, and we may not be able to schedule additional classes.

In cases of excess enrollment, some attendance restrictions will be imposed. In cases of insufficient enrollment, classes may be cancelled. Enrollment in a class will be handled accordingly.

The contact person listed on the online enrollment form will receive an email approximately 24-48 hours prior to the class confirming their registration and providing the classroom/location information. If the class fills up, the applicant will be notified by email that they have been placed on a waiting list and will be contacted if there are cancellations.

CANCELLATION POLICY

If a student is unable to attend, it is the agency's responsibility to cancel at least 24 hours prior to the class. Frequent no shows may result in your agency receiving lower priority in future enrollments.

CONSULTANT POLICY

Enrollment for consultants will be allowed in all Technology Transfer training classes except for local agency only classes. Due to the popularity of our classes, we must limit each consulting firm to a maximum of four attendees per class.

CERTIFICATES

A certificate of completion will be awarded to students who successfully complete the final examination for the class. In classes where final exams are not given, a certificate of attendance will be awarded. The majority of T2 classes meet the requirements for professional development hours. The number of PDHs given per class can be found with the course description; however, it is the student's responsibility to ensure that the course meets the continuing education requirements of their license.

NOTE: CHANGES TO SCHEDULING OF FLAGGER TRAININGS

IDOT recommends retraining flaggers every three years. Flaggers who have not been trained in the last three years should be scheduled for training or use the online version of Flagger Safety training.

Flagger training sessions are scheduled regionally throughout the state. Additional trainings may be added and announced monthly from the T2 email subscription service. However, our capacity to add classes is limited. If your agency has a training room that is computer/projector accessible, will seat at least 50 participants and is open to employees from other agencies, please email Stephanie Stoverink or Barry Kent to be considered for a class onsite at your location.

The U.S. Department of Labor and the Illinois Department of Labor have not specifically defined flagging as a hazardous job. However, the Illinois Department of Transportation recognizes that certain hazards and risks come with the job. Therefore, registration for and participation in flagger training classes and activities are limited to participants aged 18 and up.

TRAINING COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - SPRING 2026

2026-27 7-Hour National USPAP

Overview: The course covers the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice, the recognized ethical and performance standards for appraisers in the U.S. Required for state-licensed and state-certified appraisers, the course reviews current standards and updates, including real property development, reporting, and appraisal review (Standards 1-4), and it is taught by an AQB Certified USPAP Instructor. Credit requires 100% attendance.

Required materials must be purchased in advance from The Appraisal Foundation and brought to class. Students without materials may attend but will not receive credit.

ADA Coordinator Group

Overview: This group will establish a collaborative network of ADA Coordinators across Illinois to support local public agencies in achieving and maintaining compliance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act. Participants will gain practical, actionable knowledge to improve accessibility and ADA Title II compliance within their community. The ADA Coordinator Group which meets every other month launched its first meeting on July 10, 2025. Over 300 attendees, representing approximately 140 agencies from across the state, participated in the first two meetings. Meetings are not recorded to encourage collaboration and idea sharing. Copies of past presentations are available upon request or through the IDOT website. Recommended for ADA Coordinators or their designees. Topics covered include ADA, Title II Ad-

ministrative Requirements, Self-Evaluations, Transition Plans, Public Right of Way Accessibility Guidelines, other federal/state laws and standards, and other topics as requested by group members.

(New) ADA Coordinators Group for Local Public Agencies

Overview: IDOT invites local agencies to join the ADA Coordinators Group, launched in July 2025 to provide resources, support and practical guidance on ADA Title II compliance. The group offers a collaborative forum to share challenges, best practices and tools to strengthen accessibility efforts.

Meeting every other month, sessions cover ADA coordinator roles and responsibilities, PROWAG, and related federal and state requirements. Intended for local public agency ADA coordinators or designees in IDOT Regions 2-5.

Chainsaw Safety Training

Overview: This course will cover safety and risk management, chainsaw operation/handling, chainsaw cutting, felling procedures, specialized cutting situations and chainsaw maintenance.

Communication Excellence: Media, Social Media and Presentation Skills

Overview: This course will provide tools to strengthen workplace communication and provide training to improve grammar, professional writing, email etiquette and effective content presentation. Participants will learn responsible social media practices, including protecting their professional roles and communities, understanding public access, FOIA, record retention requirements and using social media strategically to promote community messaging.

Eminent Domain and Appraisal Issues

Overview: This 5-hour IDFP approved CE course reviews 2024 updates to 49 CFR Part 24 and resulting 2025 revisions to IDOT's Land Acquisition Policies and Procedures Manual. Topics include updated terminology and procedures aligned with FHWA, USPAP and state law and how IDOT is implementing changes to strengthen credible fair market value opinions. The course also covers common appraisal errors, advanced eminent domain concepts, and USPAP's Competency Provision. Designed for appraisers, review appraisers, waiver valuers, oversight staff, and others impacted by DOT policy and procedural updates.

TRAINING COURSE DESCRIPTIONS - SPRING 2026

Flagger Training

Overview: This class provides training to local agency personnel for their day labor and maintenance activities. It meets requirements established by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration.

Prerequisites: This course is available to local agency highway personnel holding a valid driver's license or an Illinois identification card from the secretary of state. Traffic control devices, the flagger's role in work zone safety, Illinois laws and responsibilities, and flagging procedures will be covered.

Live Line Demo

Overview: This course includes in person training from safety experts about electricity and how to stay safe around high voltage overhead power lines. It is well-suited for public works departments and first responders, providing lessons on how to respond in an emergency when dealing with fallen power lines/wires, whether they're on the road or if maintenance equipment accidentally comes into contact with them overhead.

OSHA 101

Overview: Illinois OSHA 101 for road/street/highway departments.

Income Property Valuation Techniques

Overview: The Income Property Valuation Techniques CE class is approved by IDFPR for four hours. This presentation will include discussion of required reporting practices from LAPPM, FHWA, USPAP and state law, as well as some elements of best practices. Included will be a discussion of different lease types, property history, sales and transfer history, overall cap rate, how to find an overall cap rate, return on vs. return of, NOI and the Mortgage Equity Technique, cost approach, calculator utilization, fee simple, leased fee, lease hold, substitution, client confidentiality, appraisal report vs. restricted appraisal report, fees, and certification requirements. Both basic and some advanced techniques will be discussed. The HP12C calculator is suggested for use in this class as well as some familiarity with its use. This class is designed for appraisers, review appraisers, waiver valuers, as well as those with oversight capacity and others interested in Income Property Valuation Techniques.

Rail Safety Education

Overview: This course provides rail safety education to local agencies promoting safe practices at high-way-rail grade crossings, supported by Illinois Operation Lifesaver. Topics include the Emergency Notification System sign, warning devices and how to navigate crossings safely.

S19-Pile Foundation Construction Inspection

Overview: This course provides guidance on pile foundation construction inspection, including verifying excavation and piling conformance with plans and specifications, performing pile capacity calculations, inspecting test pile installation and driving operations, and evaluating pile splicing. It also covers required measurements, calculations, and documentation for pay items such as furnishing and driving piling, pile shoes, test piles, concrete encasement, and extra work related to splicing.

- Each consultant company may send two people and must be IDOT prequalified for construction inspection.

STTP S-33 Soils Field Testing and Inspection Course

Overview: This course prepares construction and materials personnel to properly perform field testing and inspection of subgrade, embankment and shallow foundations. It also addresses common geotechnical issues and typical corrective actions. Upon completion, participants will be able to determine field moisture content and in-place wet and dry densities, use the Family of Curves and One-Point Proctor to establish Standard Dry Density and Optimum Moisture Content, calculate percent compaction and OMC, assess soil strength and stability using static and dynamic cone penetrometers, inspect embankment construction, evaluate roadway subgrades and undercut depths, and verify foundation adequacy for box culverts and shallow structures through inspection and soil testing.

Title II ADA: Quality Transition Planning, How to use IDOT's New Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan Template and Companion Guide

Overview: A three-hour training course will be offered in a virtual format to discuss quality transition planning and to introduce IDOT's new template and companion guide which is focused on ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Planning for facilities within the public right of way. The course includes a review of local agency ADA Title II Administrative Requirements, obligations, and IDOT's Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan compliance review process. In addition, the course includes an introduction and review of the new SETP template available for agency use. Attendees will learn how to use and the template to create a quality plan that can be utilized and updated until access barriers are removed. Findings from the review of transition plans across the state will be shared so that your agency can avoid common pitfalls and create a useful and quality plan.

Tractor Mower Operator Safety Training

Overview: This workshop combines both classroom and hands-on training to instruct participants on the best safety practices for industrial mower operator safety. Classroom topics include responsible operation, safety practices of hazards and risks, before/during operation, shutdown and maintenance. Hands-on training topics include equipment inspection, safety signage placement, use of checklists, safe operating techniques and personal protective gear use.

Quality ADA Transition Planning, How to use IDOT's New Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan Template and Companion Guide

Overview: This training will cover quality transition planning and introduce IDOT's new template and companion guide which is focused on ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Planning for facilities within the public right of way. The course includes a review of local agency ADA Title II Administrative Requirements, obligations, and IDOT's Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan compliance review process. Additionally, it will provide an introduction of the new SETP template available for agency use. Attendees

will learn how to use the template to create a quality plan that can be used and updated until access barriers are removed. Findings from the review of transition plans across the state will be shared so that your agency can avoid common pitfalls and create a useful and quality self-evaluation and transition plan. Recommended for local public agencies and ADA Coordinators/Responsible Employees. Topics covered include ADA, Title II Administrative Requirements, Self-Evaluations, Transition Plans, Public Right-of-way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG) and other federal/state laws and standards.
