## WHAT IS A ROAD DIET?

According to FHWA Safety Program, a typical Road Diet converts an existing four-lane undivided roadway segment to a three-lane segment consisting of two through lanes and a center two-way left-turn lane (TWLTL). A Road Diet can reduce crash rates compared to a traditional four-lane undivided roadway.

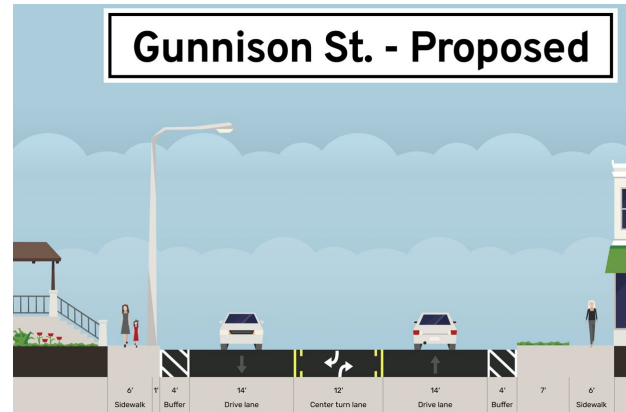
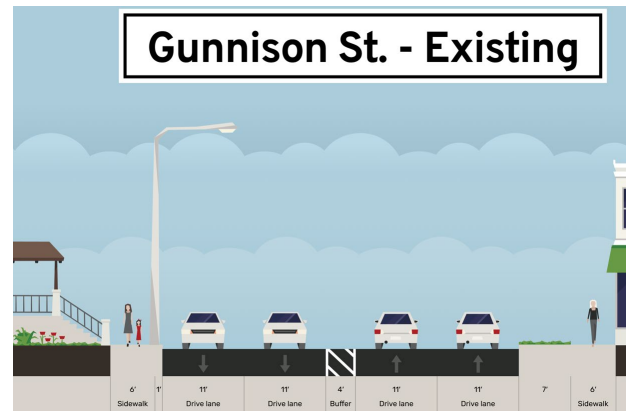
