KENNEDY EXPRESSWAY OUTBOUND LANE IMPROVEMENTS

Anticipated Spring 2025 - Fall 2025

Overview

Officially opened in 1960, the Kennedy Expressway supports and average of 275,000 vehicles a day. In 2025, IDOT will start the rehabilitation of the I-90/I-94 outbound lanes to increase safety, reduce maintenance costs and improve traffic flow.

Project efforts totaling approximately \$150 million will accomplish:

- Repairs to bridge decks along I-90/94
- Pavement patching
- Overhead sign-structure replacements
- Installing new signage
- LED lighting upgrades
- Structural painting
- Rehabilitation of the Reversible Lane Access Control (REVLAC) system

Rehabilitation Timeline

Outbound lane improvements will continue through fall 2025 and will require lane and ramp closures. IDOT will provide a schedule of all planned closures and estimated durations. Below is a general timeline for a single bridge rehabilitation and each structure typically requires six weeks to complete.










1 week to demolish bridge deck 2 weeks to replace and repair bridge joints

1 week to install latex concrete 2 weeks to let concrete set to ensure full strength
