

IL Route 4/15 Kaskaskia River Bridge Study St. Clair County, Illinois COMMUNITY CONTEXT AUDIT SUMMARY



Below is a summary of twelve Community Advisory Group (CAG) members Community Context Audit (CCA) forms collected during a meeting held November 9th 2022. A collection of comments and responses (shown in Italic) along with a tally count is presented below.

This information will help to define the purpose and need of the proposed transportation improvements based upon community goals and local plans for future development.
