Biography of Lieutenant Colonel Zach Pellman

Lieutenant Colonel Zach Pellman was appointed as the Assistant Deputy Director of the Division of Patrol - Strategic Operations Command in June 2024. He became an Illinois State Police Trooper in 2007 and has held a diverse range of assignments to include: patrol assignments in District 7 (Troop 2) and District 9 (Troop 6), various investigative assignments, an administrative assignment with the Office of Labor Relations and Special Projects, and in 2023, was appointed as the Assistant Deputy Director of the Division of Forensic Services.

During his career, he served as a patrol Field Training Officer, an investigative case agent, investigative squad leader, investigative Field Training Agent Coordinator, Investigative Commander, and the Division of Internal Investigation Southern Commander over an area of responsibility consisting of 75 counties within the State of Illinois. His investigative experience includes case work and supervision of homicides, officer involved shooting investigations, death investigations, sexual assault investigations, white collar crime and many other criminal and administrative matters at the state and federal levels.

Lieutenant Colonel Pellman is the recipient of numerous ISP certificates of recognition and work unit citations, awards, and campaign ribbons for team and individual accomplishments. Lieutenant Colonel Pellman completed the ISP Basic Investigators Course, is a certified Illinois State Police instructor, provided testimony as a subject matter expert for the ISP, completed the Northwestern University School of Police Supervision, General Command and Staff School, the University of South Florida's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Certificate Program, the FBI LEEDA trilogy program, and many other leadership courses. Prior to his employment with the ISP, Lieutenant Colonel Pellman attained a Bachelor's Degree at Benedictine University with a major in psychology and was a collegiate athlete.
