Competitive Freight Program Overview

Program Overview

» 2023 Competitive Freight Program

- Part of the ongoing Illinois State Freight Plan
- Federal funding for this program is reauthorized under the 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)

» Previous Program

- 2018 Competitive Freight Program
- 46 applications received requesting \$600 million of federal funds
- 23 projects funded for \$245 million federal funding, leveraging \$57 million in local match

Funding and Phasing

» Funding

- Federal Funds
- \$200 million (\$49.6 million per year for FY23-FY26)
- 20% non-federal match required (10% on Interstates)
- Up to 30% of funding can go to intermodal (rail, water) projects

» Project Phases

- Phase I, Phase II, Land Acquisition, or Construction Funding*
 - *Applicants must demonstrate appropriate planning, right-of-way, or coordination activities for each phase have taken place
 - For non-construction funding, applicants must have a delivery strategy that demonstrates a high likelihood that this funding will lead to construction of a project

Illinois 2023 State Freight Plan

Project Eligibility

» Local, state or federal governmental agencies are eligible for the program

- Private entities <u>must</u> have a public sponsor
- Partnerships strongly encouraged
- » Highway projects must be on the Primary Highway Freight System or Critical Urban/Rural Freight Corridors
 - If a selected project is not on one of these corridors, IDOT will redesignate the corridor to ensure eligibility
- Intermodal projects can be on a public or private freight rail or water facility

Essential features:

- Application includes the ability to log in, save and return later, upload files, and submit multiple applications through one account.
- Both highway and intermodal projects will use the same application.
- Log in is not required to submit, but applicants must log in to save progress
- Applicants should save a copy of their application locally. <u>Applicants will not have access to their application after the program closes.</u>
- Once an application is submitted using the "Submit" button, no more changes can be made.
- A copy of the application will be sent to the email address entered on page 1 (check spam filter).

Application Structure

Section	Content
1. Applicant Information	Project Title, Contact and Agency Information
2. Project Information	Description, Sketch, Location, Inclusion in Plan, Municipality/Township, Facility Name, Sponsor, Letters of Support
3. Registration Information	Registration Numbers
4. Project Funding Information	Total Cost, Funds Requested, Finance and Cost Estimate Forms, Funding Eligibility, Financial Assurance Letters
5. Supplementary Freight Information	Urban vs. Rural, On vs. Off Priority Freight Network (PFN), Project Importance to Freight, Highway vs. Intermodal Project
6. Highway OR Intermodal Scoring	Score the project in up to five Highway Goal Areas or up to three Intermodal Goal Areas
7. Crosscutting Measures	Applicable Partnerships, Project Readiness, Equity and Environmental Justice Impacts
8. Submittal Page	Upload any additional supporting information and submit application

2. Modal Connectivity	2a. Describe how the project contributes to improving the capacity for modal connectivity within the Illinois intermodal freight system.	2b. Intermodal (rail-truck, water-truck, water-rail) connections added to the network 2c. Increased intermodal volume

» Applicants only need to fill out questions in applicable goal areas. It is not expected that a project will score in all 3 categories.

» Applicants must provide data and scoring methodology. Program Guidance includes detailed info about each measure and resources such as standard intermodal freight conversion values

Crosscutting Measures

Goal Area 1 – Applicable Partnerships

• Based on the number and nature of material partnerships in the project

Goal Area 2 – Project Readiness

- Based on the whether following elements are complete:
- Site Plan, Corridor Plan, Feasibility Studies, Master Plan or other planning work completed

- Phase I (Prelim Engineering, NEPA) completed
- Phase II (PS&E, Ready for Construction Letting) completed
- Right-of-Way or Easements acquired or N/A
- Railroad Approvals (if required) acquired or N/A
- If Phase I is not begun or underway, please identify NEPA Class of Action.

Goal Area 3 – Equity and Environmental Justice Impacts

- All applicants must describe the impacts the project will have on the surrounding communities
- Points may be awarded if project mitigates freight impacts and is located in:
- A Justice40 Transportation Disadvantaged Community; and/or
- An Illinois EPA Environmental Justice Area; and/or
- A DCEO Opportunity Zone.

- **Project 2 (Intermodal):** Repair the dock wall at the Illinois International Port District (IIPD)

» Program highlights

- Applications due Dec 19, 2022
- \$200 million (\$49.6 million per year for FY23-FY26)
- 20% non-federal match
- Must have a public sponsor
- Must address a freight need
- Application

 - Intermodal: 3 goal areas (score projects in one or more areas)
